Modern History

- Britain 1918-1997- political history, women's rights, race & immigration, the welfare state, & Margaret Thatcher.
- USA 1918-1955 – difficulties in 1920s; KKK, prohibition, women's rights & organised crime. Causes and events of the Wall Street Crash, Great Depression, WWII, transformation of American into a superpower – including Civil Rights & the Cold War.
- The Witch Craze 1518-1750 – including 5 case studies from Britain, Europe & North America – the role of science & reason in ending the witch trials.



OR

Early Modern History

- The Tudor Dynasty – Monarchs from Henry VIII to Elizabeth I, their methods of rule, rebellion & threats - economic, social & religious change.
- The development of Protestant Reformation in Germany – Martin Luther
- The Witch Craze 1518-1750 – including 5 case studies from Britain, Europe & North America – the role of science & reason in ending the witch trials.

Key political, social & economic features of societies in France, Anglo Saxon Britain and Tsarist & Communist Russia through studies of:

- French Revolution and Napoleon 1774-1815
- Alfred and the Making of England 871-1016
- Russia and its Rulers 1855-1964



Studying the impact of rulers on society such as Stalin, Lenin, Louis XVI & Napoleon and the impact of conflicts on society such as WWII and the Cold War.



- Independent study - brings together many of the skills developed in an independently researched enquiry of your own choosing.













3 exams & coursework – independent research on subject of your choice – based around historic debate
